Duff, Francis Apperson & Martin Deloy Surtist all of the County of Clay and State of Illinois are held and firmly bound to the people of the State of Illinois in the penal sum of Two thousand five hundred dollars for the payment of which well and truly to be made we bind ourselves each of us our heirs, Executors and Administrators firmly by these presents signed with our hands and sealed with our seals dated at Maysville this 5th day of June A.D. 1841

The condition of the above bond is such that if the above bound James Cheek shall perform all the duties required to be performed by him as Collector of the said County of Clay in the time and manner prescribed by law and when he shall be succeeded in office shall surrender and deliver over to his Successor in office all books papers and moneys belonging to said County or to the State and appertaining to his said office then the above bond to be void and of no effect otherwise to remain in full force and
