Hill, Mary A. Fisher, Elizabeth Hill,  
George W. Hill and William D. Hill  
are named defendants there is man-  
ifest error, to wit:

1. In this, that the County court  
erred in entertaining jurisdiction  
of the cause and in making an order for the  
sale of the land to pay debts when it affi-  
matively appeared the defendants had not  
been legally notified of the intended applica-  
tion of the executor

2. Said court also erred in holding that there was proof of notice to two of the defendants when it was apparent that neither the summons or published notice were in conformity with law.

3. It nowhere appears in the record or proceedings of the County court that the executor had made and filed an inventory, appraisement bill and sale bill as is required by law.

4. There is no averment in the petition, or proof in any part of the record, that the personal estate of Thomas Hall, the deceased, was insufficient to pay the just claims against the estate.

5. There is no evidence or any mention or proof in the record of any of the facts necessary to be proved in order to warrant the County court in ordering the sale of the land.

6. It appears by the record, the County court entered an order, at the January term 1863, of proceedings at the February and April terms following, when, by law, said court could not properly record the proceedings it may have anticipated would occur at a future term.

Plaintiff is in error therefore  
prayer to quash and proceedings of  
said County court may be reversed.
