is such that Whereas the above named Thomas Plumleigh
did on the Eighth day of April A.D. 1828 in the
Circuit Court of said County recover a judgment
against the above bounden Thomas M White for
the sum of One hundred and fifty five dollarz and
Eighty Cents judgment and costs of suit from which said
judgment of the said Circuit Court the said Thomas
M White has taken an appeal to the Supreme Court
of the State of Illinois Now if the said Thomas M White
shall well and truly prosecute his said Appeal to effect
and shall pay and satisfy whatever judgment costs
interest and damages shall be adjudged in the
said Supreme Court in case the said judgment
shall be affirmed there the above obligation to be
void else to remain in full force and effect

Thomas M. White & Deb. And now came the Plaintiff
by Arnold his attorney and the
Defendant by Plim his Counsel also came, and issue
being joined herein it is ordered that a Jury come, and
by the agreement of the parties this cause is tried by a Jury
of twelve, and thenceforth come a Jury of good and lawful
men in terms of said agreement to wit, B. P. Hyde, Asst. Donnelly,
Dexter O. May, William H. Whittier, John W. Bay, Daniel
Kimball, Abiel Walker, A. M. Remond, Nathan Town, Thomas
Brooks and Gilbert Brainerd, who being duly empannelled and
sworn men and truly to try the issue joined herein and having

having the evidence and arguments of Counsel they returned
to Consider upon their Verdict and Subsequently they returned
into Court and delivered the following Verdict to wit. We the
jury find for the Plaintiff, for the sum of one hundred and
thirty nine dollars and eleven cents debt and after the
Plaintiff damages at the sum of sixteen dollars and sixty nine
cents. It is therefore ordered and Commanded by the Court that
the said Plaintiff have and recover of the defendant
the sum of One hundred and thirty nine dollars and
eleven cents his debt and the sum of sixteen dollars and
sixty nine cents his damages for the detention thereof
assessed as aforesaid amounting in the whole to the sum
of One hundred and fifty five dollars and Eighty
cents his debt and damages as also his expenses
having been expended and that he have execution
therefor

At a Thunster term. On the 11th day of April
in the year last aforesaid the following proceeding
was had to wit.

Thomas M. White } Debt. And now our friend
attorney for the defendant and
moves the Court for an appeal herein to the Supreme
Court of the which is granted him upon condition that
he enter into bond in the sum of three hundred dollars
maintained according to law with John Bunting and
Josua B. Thorpe as his securities within twenty days
from this date before the Clerks of this Court
