in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight
hundred and fifty it being one of the days
of the late said September term in the year last
aforesaid the following proceedings were had to wit

This day comes the
plaintiff by Gresh his attorney
and the defendant by McCloud his attorney also come
and submit they come to the Court for trial the
Court after hearing the evidence and arguments
of counsel find the issues joined in favor of
the plaintiff and assess his damages at Thirty

four dollars. It is considered by the Court that the plaintiff has and does give against the defendant the sum of thirty four dollars and his acts in this suit expended and have execution therefor to which the defendant excepts and prays an appeal to the Supreme Court which is allowed upon condition that he enter into Bond in the penal sum of One hundred dollars with A. W. Bumsby as his security in thirty days from this date.

And thereafter to wit. On the first day of October in the year past aforesaid the said defendant filed in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of said County his appeal bond in the words and figures following to wit

Know all men by these presents that we James M. Storde as principal and Abner W. Bumsby as security of the County of McHenry and State of Illinois are held and firmly bound unto Henry Peter also of the same County and State in the penal sum of one hundred dollars lawful money of the United States for the payment of which we and truly to be made we and each of our heirs our heirs executors and administrators jointly severally and finally by these presents set our hands and seals this first day of September A.D. 1850.

The conception of the above obligation is such that whereas the said Henry Peter died on the 20th day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty in the Circuit Court in and for the said County and State aforesaid never a judgment against the above bounden James M. Storde for the sum of Thirty four dollars and cents debt and dollars and

Cents costs, from which said judgment of the said
Circuit Court the said James M. Stodge has prayed for
and obtained an appeal to the Supreme Court of
said State. Now if the said James M. Stodge shall
duly prosecute his said appeal with effect and
shall moreover pay the amount of the judgment
costs interest and damages undisturbed to be rendered
against him in case the said judgment shall
be affirmed in the said Supreme Court then the
above obligation to be void otherwise to remain
in full force and virtue. J. M. Stodge (Seal)
