Justin Harlan, Judge; John Scholfield, Esq., States Attorney; John D. Newlin, Sheriff; and Hiram Johnson, Clerk.

Court was opened by Sheriff in due form. When, among other things, the following proceedings were had, in the cause wherein Mary Ann Walker and George C. Walker were petitioners, and Thomas W. Walker, Franklin Walker, Charles S. Walker and John A. Walker were defendants, in a Petition for Partition.

The following is an abstract of the facts contained in the record in this cause, to-wit:

This petition, filed by Mary Ann Walker and George C. Walker, shows that one James C. Walker, late a resident of Crawford county, Illinois, died intestate on the 21st day of March, 1856, leaving him surviving Mary Ann Walker, his widow, Thomas W. Walker, Julia Ann Walker, Charles L. Walker, John A. Walker and George C. Walker, his heirs at law, and that he died seized in fee simple of the following described tract of land, to-wit: one hundred and ten acres off of the north end of the north-east quarter of section number twenty-seven in township number seven north of range eleven west, lying and being in the county of Crawford aforesaid. (See record, pages 1 and 2, line 1 to 49 inclusive.)

The petition further alleges that the widow aforesaid has a dower estate in said real estate, and that said George C. Walker, Thomas W. Walker, Julia Ann Walker, Charles L. Walker and John A. Walker are each entitled to one-fifth of said land, as heirs of James C. Walker, dec'd, subject to the dower estate of said widow. (See record, pages 2 and 3, lines 50 to 59 inclusive.) And also that Thomas W. Walker, Julia Ann Walker, Charles L. Walker and John A. Walker are each infants under the age of eighteen years and have no guardians at law. (See record page 3, line 59 to 63 inclusive.)

The petition contains a prayer making the above named minors defendants, and that a guardian *ad litem* be appointed for said minor defendants, and usual prayer for partition of said real estate, and general prayer for relief. (See record, page 3, line 64 to 85 inclusive.)

Then follows affidavit of George C. Walker to the truth of the petition and jurat of the officer and endorsements on the petition. (See record, page 4, line 96 to 109 inclusive.) Also an entry made in the record by the Clerk of the Crawford County Circuit Court stating that there is no summons to be found in his office. (See record, page 4, line 110 to 114 inclusive.)

Then follows the answer of a guardian *ad litem*, asking that the court protect the interests of the minor defendants of said petition and the file marks thereon. (See record, pages 4, 5 and 6, line 114 to 149 inclusive.)

The record further shows that afterwards, but at the same term of the said court, on the motion of the attorney for the petitioners, George W. Peck was appointed guardian *ad litem* for the said minor defendants. (See record, page 6, line 150 to 166 inclusive.) And that the court decreed upon the petition answer of guardian *ad litem*, exhibits and proofs that partition be made as prayed in the petition, and that commissioners were appointed to partition said real estate and make report. (See record, pages 6 and 7, line 166 to 198 inclusive.)

And that afterwards at said term of the said court said commissioners made report that division could not be made without manifest prejudice to the proprietors of the same. (See record, pages 7, 8 and 9, line 198 to 241 inclusive.)

And that afterwards, to-wit: at said October term, 1858, said report

of commissioners was submitted to the court and approved. (See record, pages 9 and 10, line 242 to 287 inclusive.)

And that afterwards, at the said October term, 1858, of the Crawford Circuit Court, the court ordered and decreed a sale of said real estate on a credit of six, twelve, eighteen and twenty-four months, and appoints a commissioner to make said sale; the said commissioner is ordered to give notice of said sale by posting up written notices in four public places four weeks prior to said sale, and also decreed and ordered that said commissioner take of the purchaser his notes, with approved personal security and a mortgage on the premises, to secure the purchase money, and make report to the next term of court. (See record, page 11, line 288 to 323 inclusive.)

And that afterwards, at the May term of said court, 1859, the said commissioner made his report of sale and reported that said real estate was sold on a credit of twelve, eighteen and twenty-four months, after having advertised the same as per said decree. (See record, pages 11, 12 and 13, line 324 to 372 inclusive.)

The report of the commissioner appointed to make sale and conveyance is accepted and approved by the Court. (See record pages 13, 14 and 15, line 373 to 435 inclusive.)

Then follows cost bill and certificate of the Clerk. (See record, pages 15, 16 and 17, line 436 to 482 inclusive.)

ASSIGNMENT OF ERRORS.

1st. The court erred in rendering a decree against the defendants below without any service of process upon them. Revised Statutes of 1845, chapter 79, page 400, section 6.

2d. The court erred in decreeing a sale of said lands without any or sufficient evidence to support the bill, the defendants all being minors. 27 Illinois Reports, page 128 and 9. Tebbs, *et al.* vs. Allen. 33 Illinois page 181. Waugh, *et al.* vs. Robbins.

3d. The decree of sale is erroneous because there is no prayer in the petition praying a sale of the land in case the same cannot be partitioned without great prejudice to the parties. Ill. Stat. of 1858, page 160, sec. 1.

4th. The court erred in confirming the report of commissioners to partition said land without requiring their oath for said purpose to be reduced to writing to accompany their report. 23 Illinois Reports page 47. Loyd, *et al.* vs. Malone, *et al.* Illinois Reports, vol. 27, page 119. Tibbs *et al.* vs. Allen.

5th. The court erred in decreeing a sale of the dower of the widow after the commissioners appointed to partition said real estate reported that the same could not be partitioned without doing the parties great injury, without first empanneling a jury to assess the yearly value of said estate. Illinois Reports, vol. 28, page 64. Francisco *et al.* vs. Hendricks.

6th. The court erred in accepting and approving the report of special commissioner to make sale of said land; because he was ordered to sell the same upon a credit of six, twelve, eighteen and twenty-four months, but sold the same upon a credit of twelve, eighteen and twenty-four months, and because there is no proof of publication of sale except the statements of said commissioner. Ill. Rep., 29 vol., pages 535 and 549. Tibbs, *et al.* vs. Allen.

Also an entry made in the record by the Clerk of the Crawford County Circuit Court stating that there is no summons to be found in his office. (See record, page 4, line 110 to 114 inclusive.)

Then follows the answer of a guardian *ad litem*, asking that the court protect the interests of the minor defendants of said petition and the file marks thereon. (See record, pages 4, 5 and 6, line 114 to 149 inclusive.)

The record further shows that afterwards, but at the same term of the said court, on the motion of the attorney for the petitioners, George W. Peck was appointed guardian *ad litem* for the said minor defendants. (See record, page 6, line 150 to 166 inclusive.) And that the court decreed upon the petition answer of guardian *ad litem*, exhibits and proofs that partition be made as prayed in the petition, and that commissioners were appointed to partition said real estate and make report. (See record, pages 6 and 7, line 166 to 198 inclusive.)

And that afterwards at said term of the said court said commissioners made report that division could not be made without manifest prejudice to the proprietors of the same. (See record, pages 7, 8 and 9, line 198 to 241 inclusive.)

And that afterwards, to-wit: at said October term, 1858, said report

of commissioners was submitted to the court and approved. (See record, pages 9 and 10, line 242 to 287 inclusive.)

And that afterwards, at the said October term, 1858, of the Crawford Circuit Court, the court ordered and decreed a sale of said real estate on a credit of six, twelve, eighteen and twenty-four months, and appoints a commissioner to make said sale; the said commissioner is ordered to give notice of said sale by posting up written notices in four public places four weeks prior to said sale, and also decreed and ordered that said commissioner take of the purchaser his notes, with approved personal security and a mortgage on the premises, to secure the purchase money, and make report to the next term of court. (See record, page 11, line 288 to 323 inclusive.)
