To the Hon. William J. Allen Judge of the
Circuit Court of said County in Chancery
setting.

Humbly complaining, your orator,
William H. Dore, a citizen of Saline County
Illinois and a tax payer therein, who sue
as well for the other taxpayers and citizens of said
County as for himself, shows unto your honor,
that in pursuance of an act of the General
Assembly of the State of Illinois, approved Feb-
ruary 7th AD 1857, entitled "An act to relocate
the County seat of Saline County," a copy of
which is find herewith, marked "A" and prayed
to be taken as part of this your orator's Bill
of Complaint, an election was held in Saline
County Illinois at the various precincts thereof
at the general election in November 1857,
for the relocation of the County seat of
said Saline County, at which said election
the Town of Harrisburg received seven hundred
and and twenty-five votes and Raleigh re-
ceived 689 votes, and that 36 persons voting
at said election did not vote for either Harris-
burg or Raleigh, for County seat, and that the
total number of persons voting at said
election was four hundred and forty.

and that Harrisburg received a majority
of all the votes cast at said election -

Your orator would further show unto
your Honor, that Harrisburg is now the
County seat of Saline County Illinois,
and as such was duly elected at said
election, and that the terms of the circuit court
of said County have been held at said
town of Harrisburg since said election,
and the County Courts of said County
have been held in said town since
January of this year 1859; and that the
clerks of the circuit and County Courts
have been keeping and holding their
offices in the said town of Harrisburg
since the month of January 1859. and
are now keeping and holding their offices in
said town -

And that the Sheriff of said
County has also been keeping and holding
his office at and in the town of Harris-
burg since the time last aforesaid -

Your orator would further show unto
your Honor, that the County Court of said County
have contracted for the erection of a court house
at and in the town of Harrisburg for
the accommodation of the Courts and
offices of said County, and also for the
erection of a jail, said buildings to cost

a large sum of money, to wit upwards of \$15,000, and that the contractors have begun to provide the materials for the erection of said buildings, and the County Court has paid the Contractors \$5000 of the contract price for the erection of the same -

Your Oator avers and charges that a large majority of the People of said County since said election, have regarded Harrisburg as the legal County seat of said County, but so it is, may it please your Honor, some evil disposed persons, unwilling that the voice of a majority of the legal voters of said County honestly and fairly expressed at the ballot box should decide between the said Towns of Harrisburg and Raleigh for County seat of said County of Saline, but anxious to keep up a continual strife and confusion in said County, relative to the "County seat question" - deny the validity of said election, and the constitutionality of the Law under which the same was held, and aver and maintain that Harrisburg was not fairly elected as the County seat at said election, but that a large number of the votes cast at said election for Harrisburg were fraudulent votes, and votes cast by persons not entitled to vote at said election at the time and place they did vote, and that Raleigh received a fair majority of the

legal voter cast at said election, and is now the legal County seat of said County of Saline -

Yours orator further avers and charges that Moses P. McClellan County Judge of said County, and James Stricklin one of the associate Justices of said County and Richard N. Wasfield, County Clerk of said County aver and maintain that said Law is unconstitutional, and the election held in pursuance thereof is and was fraudulent and void -

Yours orator further avers that Willis A. Stricklin, Sheriff of said County, avers and maintains that said Law is unconstitutional, and the said election fraudulent and void -

Yours orator further avers that although said Truman Bennett, Clerk of the Circuit Court of said County holds and keeps his office at and in the ~~said~~ said town of Harrisburg, denies that said town is legally the County seat of said County, and avers and maintains that Ralph is the legal County seat of said County and was so fairly elected at said election, and that Harrisburg is only apparently the County seat of said County, and not so in law.

Yours orator further avers that said Richard N. Wasfield, County Clerk, and Willis A. Stricklin

Sheriff of said County, thereunto and say they intend to remove their offices to the town of Raleigh, and hold and keep them there, and the said Moses P. McGehee County Judge and James Sticklin associate Justices of said County threaten and say they intend to remove their offices to said Town of Raleigh and to open and hold the County Courts of said County at Raleigh and not at Harrisburg as your orator avers they should do.

Your orator states according to the best of his knowledge information and belief, that in case said ~~and~~ County Clerk, Sheriff, County Judge and associate Justices remove their offices to said town of Raleigh, that William Watkins, who is also a member of the County Court will exercise the duties of his office as one of the associate Justices of the County Court of said County at said town of Raleigh.

Your orator further avers and charges that there is great danger that if the other officers remove their offices to Raleigh as they threaten and intend, that Brian Burnett Clerk of the Circuit Court of said County who is so dis affected with said town of Harrisburg, will remove, keep and hold his office to and at said town of Raleigh and not keep the same at Harrisburg as he should do.

Your orator further shows unto your Honor, that the schedule hitherto annexed, marked

"B" contains a list of the votes cast at said election, showing the place at which each person voted respectively, which is prayed to be taken as part of this Bill. Your orator avers that to the best of his knowledge, information and belief, the seven hundred and twenty-five votes cast for Harrisburg at said election, were cast by persons entitled to vote at said election at the time and place they did vote, and that said town received a fair and honest majority of all the votes cast at said election, and is now the legal County-seat of said County -

Your orator further shows unto your honor, that said act contains no provision authorizing the election returns to be contested, and that there is no provision of the Laws of this State authorizing an election of that kind to be contested -

Your orator charges that the acts and doings of said Moses P. McRae & James Stricklin members of the County Court, Willis A. Stricklin Sheriff of said County & Richard A. Warfield County Clerk of said County in denying that Harrisburg is the legal County-seat of said County, and in insisting that Raleigh is the legal County-seat, act contrary to Equity and good conscience and that their malice and intentions to remove their offices to said town of Raleigh, and the willingness of said Hiram Smith circuit clerk and Williams Wattkins County justice

to also remove their offices to said town of Raleigh
in case said other offices remove there manifest-
ly to the injury of your orator and other officers
of said County of Saline, and has the effect of
harassing and annoying the public mind upon
the subject of the location of the County seat
of said County, towards the improvement of said
Town of Harrisburg and vicinity, and may
work to the great damage and ~~loss~~ loss of
said County of Saline and the tax-payers thereof
in the forfeiture of the contract for the erection of
public buildings as aforesaid -

Now your orator submits to this
honorable Court, whether said Act as aforesaid
is not unconstitutional, valid and binding, and
whether the election held under said law is not
legal so far as authority to hold an election
under said Law is concerned -

Desasmuch as your orator is without re-
lief save in ^a court of Chancery, where
matters of this kind are actionable and cogn-
izable, and inasmuch as the officers
aforesaid treat to remove their offices dur-
ing the ensuing week, your orator prays
that Moses P. McGehee, James Stricklin and
William Mathews, members of the County
Court, Richard N. Warfield County Clerk,
Willis A. Stricklin Sheriff, and Stephen
Bennett, Circuit Clerk of said County

of Salem be made defendants to this your orator's Bill of Complaint, and in order that the question may be finally determined and settled as to whether Hanesburg or Raleigh is legally the County seat of said County, Your orator prayeth that Summons in Chancery issue, directing commanding to returnable on and that said defendants be examined under their ~~respective~~ corporal oaths to answer =

1st "Whether or not any of the persons who voted at said election were illegal voters, stating the names number and cause or causes of the disqualification in each case"

2nd "To state to the best of their knowledge & information for what place, ~~whether~~ Hanesburg or Raleigh each of said voters cast their votes"

And may it please your Honor to grant the writ of injunction issuing out of and under the seal of said Court, commanding restraining and enjoining the said Moses P. McCleses, James Stricklin, William Watkins, Richard C. Warfield Willis A. Stricklin and Hiram Bennett officers as aforesaid from removing their offices and the books and papers thereof from the town of Hanesburg to the town of Raleigh, and from exercising

said offices at said town of Raleigh - and
enjoining them and each of them to remain
with their offices and the books and papers
thereof at said town of Hamptonsburg -
And may it please your Honor to grant
such other and further relief, as to Equity and
good conscience belong, and as in
duty bound will ever pray &c -

"An Act to relocate the County seat of Edin-
burgh County.

Sec. 1. "Be it enacted by the People of the State of Il-
linois, represented in the General Assembly:
That at the election to be held on the
Tuesday after the first Monday in November
One thousand eight hundred and fifty
seven in the County a poll shall be opened
at each of the election precincts in said County,
to decide upon the relocation of the County
seat of said County, The places to be
voted for shall be Raleigh, the present
County seat, and Harrisburg the pro-
posed County seat, and no others.
The qualified voters of said County may
vote upon said question - Those desiring
the County seat to remain at Raleigh shall
have printed or written upon their ballots
"For County seat Raleigh," those wishing
to remove said County seat, shall have
printed or written upon their ballots, "For
County seat, Harrisburg."

Sec. 2. When the County Clerk of said
County gives notice of the election in
November A.D. 1857, it shall be his
duty to state in said Notice that said
poll will be opened at the election pre-
cincts of said according to the

provisions of this act:

Sec 3- The judges and clerks of said election shall make returns of said election in the manner and time now prescribed by Law in regard to other elections in this State -

Sec 4- When the returns shall have been made to the Clerk of the County Court of said County, of Saline, he shall proceed to open and count the votes given for the removal of the seat of justice at the town of Harrisburg, and also the votes given for retaining the seat of justice at Raleigh; the opening and counting of said votes shall be in accordance with the Laws requiring the opening and counting of the votes of the elections in this State, and if a majority of all the votes cast for and against the removal and relocation are in favor of locating at Harrisburg, then Harrisburg shall be and remain the permanent seat of justice of said County of Saline - And the County Court of said County shall provide temporary buildings for the accommodation of the County offices and the Courts of said County, and shall, at once

as practicable proceed to erect permanent public buildings, and the officers of said County shall, on or before the 1st day of January A D 1858, remove their offices to said new County seat, together with all the books, papers, records documents and appurtenances, belonging thereto, and the County and Circuit Courts of said County shall be held in the town of Stanisburg -

Sec 5-

This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
