Hugh O'Gro On motion of plaintiff, ordered
that attachment upon returnable date under against
Charles W Burkhardt, and the plaintiff moved to
desist the appeal and upon consideration the
motion so overruled.

Said at another day to wit, on
Friday the 26th day of October 1855 being the 5 day
of the Term the said Cause came on to be tried and
the following order & judgment of the Court was
made in the premises

Said now to this
day came the parties and agreed upon and submitted
to the Court a jury to wit Oliver Gilson, George

Kirk, William Marshall, Wm Dillier, L D Sutherland
John F. Schumkelius, Edward Shad, John S. Barnes
Cemp Soley, Thos Leppen, Thos Rumpf and
Willis Williams who being elected jurors and
sworn the truth to say, per the oaths joined upon
their oaths do say we the jury find the defendant
-ant guilty and assess plaintiff damages at
forty dollars and thereupon the defendant
mane for a new trial was allowed,

And at another day to wit,
at a circuit court began and held in the City
of New York in the County of Kings
on the 10th Monday in the month of May
1858. And on the 3 day of the term the said Willi-
am H. Parikh pending as pro se and succeeded
the said Court again came in to be tried, and
thereupon the following justments & proceedings
were had and made a matter of record

Hugh Collyer on this day came into
Court and the said being joined with the
defendant having put himself upon the bar
to trial, let a jury come and there came
the sum of a jury to wit Nathaniel Attitash
John Aver, Charles Collins, Abraham Beales,
John Abbott, James Barker, J H Bellingsby, Dr
Henry, Wm Lushay, R B Wallace, Benjamin Vrooman
Geo Muchler, who being elected trier and sworn
the truth to say of and on the said joined upon
their oaths do say "We the jury find the defendant
guilty and assess the plaintiffs damages at four
seven dollars and fifty cents & thereupon ac-
corded

and moved for a new trial which said motion is overruled and judgment is hence entered against the said defendant in favor of the plaintiff for the sum of forty seven dollars and fifty cents the damages of expenses of suit. And thereupon the defendant prayed and appeal to the Supreme Court, which is allowed upon condition that the defendant enter into bond in the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars within thirty days next to William A Hughes secured

Sue at another day to wit, at the Rules held in the Clerk's office of our said Circuit Court on the 29th day of May 1856. Came the said defendant and entered into bond in the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars with William A Hughes secured and said Bond is marked (C)



Know all men by these presents that Hugh
McGee and William A. Hughes of the County
of Ulster and State of Illinois are hereinafter
jointly bound unto John S. Smith of Laclede County
and State to the sum of One hundred and fifty
Dollars. On the payment whereof well and truly
to be made and performed we bind ourselves
our heirs & executors administrators or assigns
jointly severally and jointly by these presents
to pay over our heirs and executors the 29th day
of May 1851.

The condition of the above obligation
is such that whereas at the May Term 1850 of the
Dubuque County Court Justice John S. Smith
^{to the Supreme Court of the State of Illinois} was granted
a writ of habeas corpus from the judgment
of Cass County rendered in favor of John S. Smith
and James Hughes ^{for} the sum of Thirty Seven
Dollars & Fifty Cents and costs at the said Term
and on the 3d day of the said Term, being the 29th
of the month in the year last of our Lord. Now if the
said Hugh McGee the above bounden shall pay the
judgments, costs, interest and damages, in case the
judgment shall be affirmed, and shall file
an appeal prosecute his appeal as aforesaid, then
this obligation to be void else to be maintained
in full force and virtue.
