On the third Thursday comes the Plaintiff by W. H & J B Underwood his attys and also come the Defendants by G. Koerner their atty and the parties being now ready for trial the Court orders that a Jury be called and twelve good men to wit he are selected and sworn to try the issue and a true verdict to render according to law and evidence. After hearing the evidence and arguments of Counsel the Jury retire to consider upon their verdict. When the Jury return into Court they publish the following verdict to wit: "We the Jury find the issue for the Plaintiff and assess his damages at Three hundred Dollars." And now the Plaintiff by his said attys moves the Court for a new trial which motion after arguments heard is by the Court denied to which decision of the Court the Plaintiff excepts. And now it is adjudged and considered by the Court that the Plaintiff recover of the Defendants the said sum of \$ 300 ⁰⁰ his damages and also his proper costs.

to be taxed and that he have execution therefor.
And now the Plaintiff by his said attys prays an
Appeal to the Supreme Court which is allowed upon
the Plaintiff filing within Sixty days from this date
his Appeal bond in the sum of Two Hundred Dollars
with Costez Crocker or James M. Robison as
Security.

On the 12th day of April 1859 the following Bond was filed
to wit:

Know all men by these presents, That we
Emery P Rogers & James M. Robison are held and
firmly bound to the President and Trustees of the Town
of Waterloo in the penal sum of Two Hundred Dollars,
for the payment of which well and truly to be made
we bind ourselves our heirs, executors and administrators
jointly severally and firmly by these presents.

Witness our hands and seals this 15th day of April
A.D. 1859.

The condition of the above obligation is such
that whereas the said Emery P Rogers did on the 31st
day of March 1859 before the Circuit Court of
St Clair County Illinois obtain a verdict of the
Jury and Judgment of said Court thereon in a certain
appeal ~~case~~ ^{said} pending in said Court wherein the ^{said} Rogers
claimed damages for the taking of a certain freehold
of him said Rogers for a certain Street in said Town,
which said verdict and Judgment was for the sum of

Three Hundred Dollars & cents, and from which said Judgment and assessment of damages for said Street the said Rogers has prayed for and obtained an Appeal to the Supreme Court of this State.

Now if the said Emery P Rogers shall prosecute his said Appeal with effect and shall moreover pray the amount of the Judgment damages & costs that may be rendered against him in case said Judgment shall be affirmed in the Supreme Court, then the above obligation to be void otherwise in force
